Upcoming Training Workshops!

The Vincent Wildlife Trust is pleased to announce that it will be running a series of **pine marten training workshops** in spring 2010. We plan to conduct a workshop in each of the following pine marten hotspots:

- Mid Wales
- North Wales
- North Yorkshire
- South Cumbria

The workshops will feature talks and displays on pine martens, and training in the necessary equipment used to detect and monitor pine martens, including hair-tubes and den boxes.

The workshops are aimed at people who are keen to get involved in pine marten survey and monitoring work, and we hope that the workshop will equip you with the skills to survey for pine martens and monitor pine marten detection equipment in your local area. It will also be a fantastic opportunity to meet likeminded people in your local area and share your enthusiasm for pine martens!

Each workshop will be a one-day event, at a weekend and free-of-charge to attend. Venues and dates will be confirmed when we have gauged how much interest there is and how many people are likely to come to each workshop.

An update from our Pine Marten Project Manager...

Fieldwork

Over the summer I have been mainly focusing on establishing, and intensively monitoring, seven sites in the south Lake District. Over these sites I have set up 65 hair-tubes and six camera traps, in order to try and gain evidence of pine martens. So far,



the pine martens have continued to elude us but we remain optimistic! I have also collected 80 scats, none of which have yielded pine marten DNA. It's good to note that folks have been keeping their eyes peeled in their local area, and I've received a few interesting and smelly packages in the post of late....

Sightings

We continue to receive many pine marten sightings reports, with some good records coming from Snowdonia, North Yorkshire, Carmarthenshire and even one from Norfolk! Over the coming months, we are planning to respond to good quality sightings using a 'hot pursuit' approach – visiting the site quickly after the sighting was reported to set up monitoring equipment and look for scats.

Publicity

We have had some good, wide-ranging publicity in the last couple of months, which has helped to generate some quality pine marten sightings reports, as mentioned above. Our highlights include:

Pine Marten Scat Survey Project Update

The 2008-2009 pine marten scat surveys of England and Wales have now been completed. Unfortunately, we did not find any scats that were confirmed as pine marten during the DNA analysis for any of our surveys.

A **huge thank you** to everyone who contributed to the surveys – we could not have done it without you! All of the surveyors will receive an end of project report by the end of the year.

We still believe that scat surveys provide a valuable tool for pine marten detection and are likely to play a role in our continuing efforts to detect pine martens in England and Wales.
