

## Volunteer role: Bat Reserve Ranger

Our Bat Reserve Ranger volunteers provide invaluable contributions to the conservation of our lesser and greater horseshoe bat reserves by carrying out vegetation management and building maintenance at bat roost sites. This work is essential to protect and enhance important roost sites for these rare bats.

This role suits those who can work as part of a team, have a moderate level of fitness and a willingness to work outside in good—and less good—weather conditions!

### Commitment (depends on the reserve)

- Flexible
- Maximum four days throughout autumn and winter, and perhaps one summer visit
- Meet at 10am and finish by 3pm

### What will you get in return?

- Dedicated staff to train you and share their knowledge of the reserve.
- Experience of building and/or habitat management.
- Trying your hand at something new whilst assisting the continued recovery and conservation of bats in Britain as part of a team.
- The wellbeing benefits of being active, connecting with people and learning new skills.
